Cherokee County, South Carolina, is served by a network of fire departments, many of which operate with a significant volunteer component, alongside some paid staff, to cover the county's diverse areas, including rural, residential, commercial, and industrial zones. The mission of the fire departments is to **aggressively preserve life and property, promote public safety, and foster economic growth within the county.** This mission is achieved through a multi-faceted approach that generally includes:

- **Fire Suppression:** Responding to and extinguishing fires in residential, commercial, industrial, and wildland settings.
- **Emergency Medical Services (EMS):** Providing rapid medical response, often as first responders.
- **Rescue Operations:** Conducting technical rescues, including extrication from vehicle accidents, confined space rescue, water rescue, and other specialized rescue operations.
- **Hazardous Materials (HazMat) Response:** Containing and mitigating incidents involving hazardous materials spills and releases.
- **Fire Prevention and Education:** Implementing programs and initiatives to prevent fires and other emergencies, such as fire safety inspections, pre-fire planning, community outreach, and public education campaigns (e.g., smoke detector installation, community service events).
- **Disaster Preparedness:** Working with local and regional emergency management agencies to prepare for and respond to natural and man-made disasters.

Many departments emphasize values such as **courage, commitment, and integrity** in their service to the community. They strive to be progressive in their training, technology, and service delivery to meet the evolving needs and expectations of Cherokee County residents.
